

SDO Caloocan: No to Dearth of Teachers for Five-Day In-Person Classes

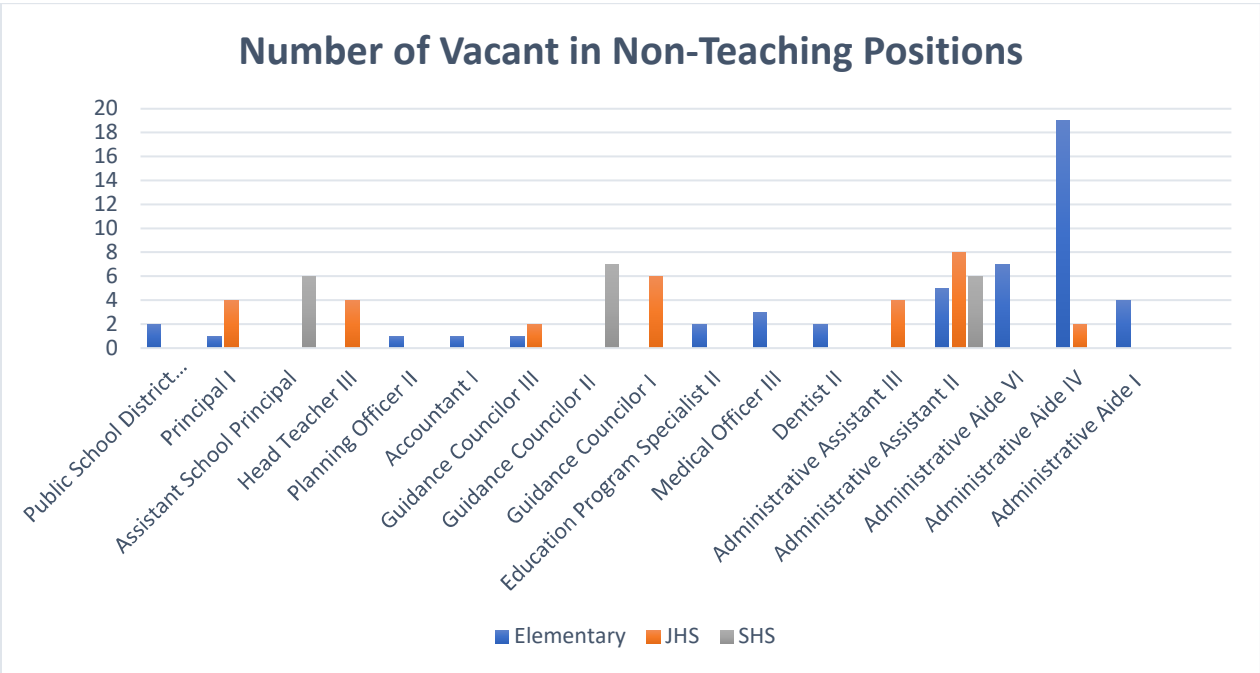
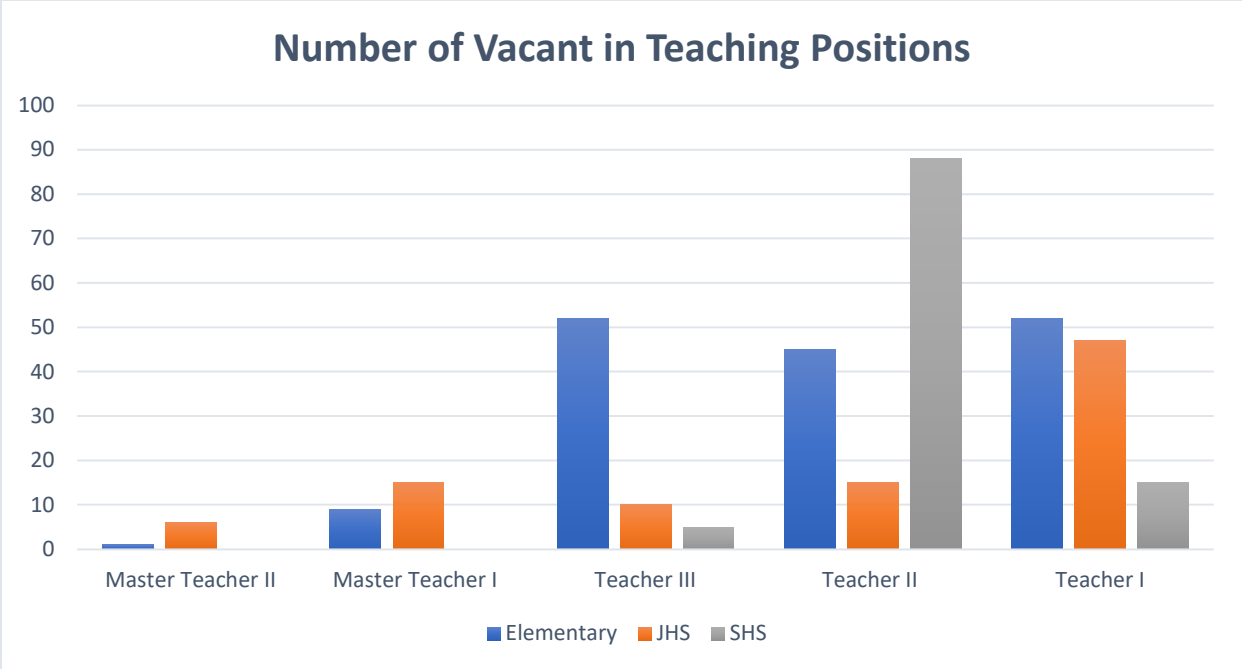

In response to the call of the DepEd Secretary, VP Sarah Duterte-Carpio for the five-day in person on November 2, 2022, the SDO Caloocan in preparation checks the current status of the teaching and non-teaching personnel to fill in the vacancies on its required number particularly of the teachers needed to cope with the dearth of the teaching personnel in the up-coming opening of classes under the firm instruction of its Schools Division Superintendent, Dr. Nerissa L. Losaria.

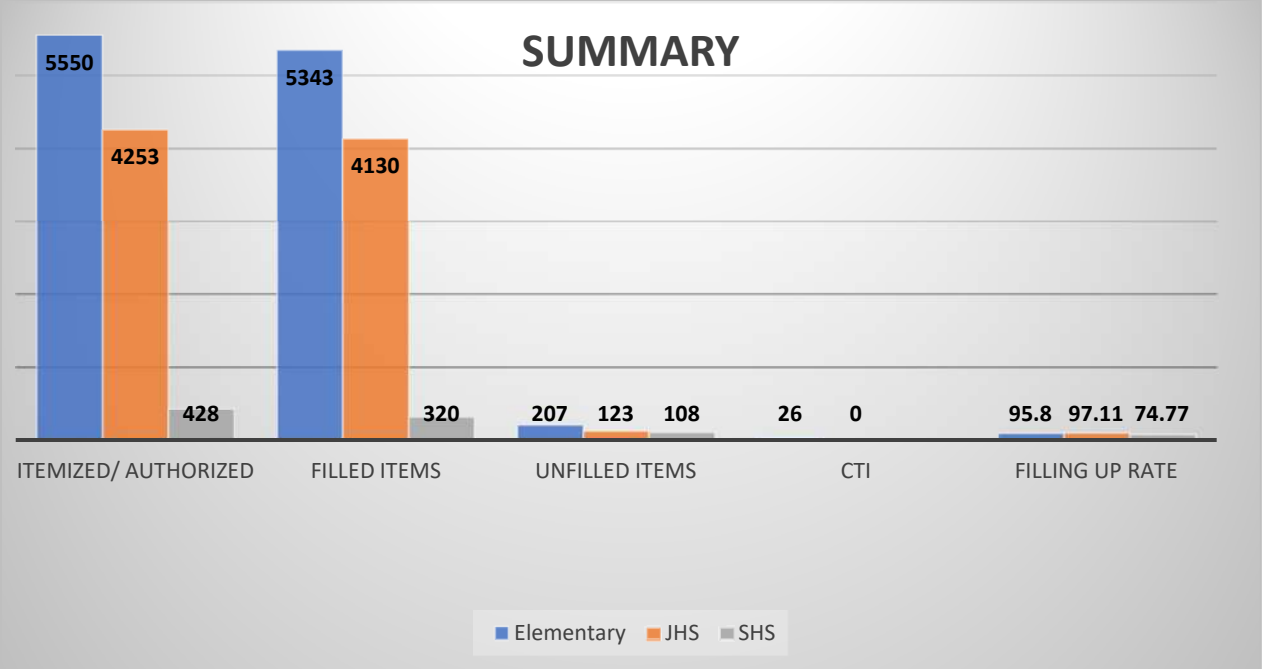
To ensure that the process of hiring is smooth and transparent, Ms. Flordelisa D. Pereyra, ASDS, and Chairperson of Human Resource Merit, Promotion and Selection Board with Ms. Ederlyn N. Castillo, Administrative Officer IV through the coordination with the CID Chief, Dr. Jocelyn M. Aliñab, steered an orientation last July 11, 2022 to all the CID supervisors on the conduct of demo-teaching and interview for the teacher-applicants which started on July 12, 2022 for the elementary followed by the Junior and Senior High School levels on July 25, 2022. Supervisors were grouped according to the number of teacher-applicants per district and per specialization for Junior High School to accommodate all the applicants and achieve the timeline for finalization and deployment.

At present, there are 102 available teaching position items with approved NOSCA for the newly created items distributed with the following breakdowns: SPIMS items: 3 for Elementary, 8 for Junior HS; 3 for DOST, and 88 for Senior HS T2. It is expected that the Registered Qualified applicants will be deployed as early as August 2, 2022. Furthermore, there are 97 unfilled non-teaching personnel available which is now posted to the field.

Based on the personnel office' data, the hereunder are the details of the available positions to fill in before the next school year begins for both non-teaching and teaching personnel.



The available data mirrors the items that have to be filled in to address the required numbers of teaching and non-teaching personnel which will greatly help implement the five-day in person classes successfully as desired by the Department of Education.
